## Jimmy O'Brien's Jig

The first, third, and fourth parts of this fine Double Jig were memorized by the editor from the playing of James O'Brien a very capable Irish piper hailing from Mayo, who sojourned in Chicago in 1876. It was printed for the first time on this side of the Atlantic in O'Neill's Music of Ireland, Chicago, 1903. A somewhat different setting of it in a much higher key entitled "Copey's Jig-Jackson" was later discovered in Clinton's Gems of Ireland - 200 Airs - London, 1841.

Its reproduction in this work is for the purpose of preserving the second part recently introduced in connection with the first as a separate tune. The enlarged arrangement justifies itself.
